Erection of bungalow, garage, outbuildings; demolition of existing bungalow

**Decision: 4** We recommend refusal for the reasons listed below.

**Comments:** We don't believe the proposed design is consistent with the character of the other buildings in the area.

It is not clear which direction the steps go, whether up or down, nor is there sufficient information relating to the height of the roof ridge. If the steps go down and the ridge is hight enough we are concerned that a mezzanine may be installed at a future point and by so doing create an increase in the habitable floor space in the future.

We are concerned about the overhangs and possible future infilling.

The chimneys are very elaborate and not in keeping with rural design. It is not clear if there are fireplaces and therefore if the chimneys serve any purpose.

The area is dark and there are no street lights. We are concerned that the amount of glazing could cause light pollution.
